

Charm Anklet

If you like dangly things and quick projects, this is it. This is an adaptable pattern. Instead of making the ankle version, a wrist bracelet can be made by decreasing the length (make sure to use an even number of stitches). Or a choker can be made by increasing the stitches. Show off your personality with the charms of your choice. I collected mine from local big box craft stores, online yarn stores and more.

Besides the casting on and binding off, this project has only 4 rows to be worked. The stitch pattern is the Linen stitch which helps create a firmer fabric.

Materials:

- DMC Senso 60% cotton/40% acrylic color: Denim 43 gms/150 yds.
1 skein (which will make several anklets)
- US #2 (2.75 mm) needles
- Size C crochet hook
- Assorted charms (I used 7)
- Metal jump rings
- Tapestry needle

Gauge: 7-8 sts = 1 inch (make sure to make a firm piece)

Finished size: 8.5 (10) inches long by .5 inch wide (not including ties)

Abbreviations:

K = Knit

P = Purl

YF = Move yarn to front of needle

YB = Move yarn to back of needle

SL = Slip stitch

St = stitch

RS = right side

WS = wrong side

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Instructions:

Starting with a slip knot about 1.5 - 2 yds from end, cast on 64 (72) sts. Purl one row (WS).

Row 1: (RS) K2, [YF, SL1, YB, K1], repeat [] to end.

Row 2: (WS) P2, [YB, SL1, YF, P1], repeat [] to end.

Repeat Rows 1 & 2 one more time. Bind off in knit stitch and weave in tail of last stitch. With long yarn tail at beginning of cast on row, weave half way up short end of rectangle. For first tie, start a crochet chain at this point for 6 inches. Work second tie in the middle of the opposite end the same length as the first. Weave in remaining yarn tails. Using jump rings, attach charms to bind off edge spacing evenly.
